- Research and studies on pressing issues concerning city administration and council affairs
- Collection, management, publication, and dissemination of domestic and international information and materials related to city development
- Undertaking various research projects commissioned by administrative agencies, public institutions, or private organizations
- Research for mutual development between Gwangju and other local governments

- June 20, 1995 > Launch of the Gwangju-Jeonnam Development Institute
 - August 6, 2007 ▶ Separation of the Gwangju Development Institute
- September 8, 2015 Integration into the Gwangju-Jeonnam Research Institute
- September 6, 2023 Depening of the Gwangju Institute and appointment of President Choi Chi-Kuk

Planning Research: Leading Regional Future Research

Conducting research on Gwangju's future-oriented municipal agendas and mid- to long-term policy development

Current Issue Research: Addressing Municipal Issues and Proposing Alternatives

Developing timely and practical alternative policy research focused on municipal issues, responding to policy trends and current administrative concerns

- Proposing and co-executing research projects with citizens and civil society


